In spite of some WWII damage this Library still functions, incorporated in 1951 as the Oberlausitzischen Library of the Sciences. The sheets are divided into two bundles and housed in two hinged boxes of archival cardboard. Although the text is complete, it lacks the frontispieces and the title page to volume 2. Light toning to title, else fine.
