Rare Book School Awards Twenty IMLS-RBS Fellowships

Charlottesville, VA, 11 February 2015 – Rare Book School (RBS) at the University of Virginia has awarded twenty IMLS-RBS Fellowships for Early-Career Librarians. "This is a great opportunity to equip younger librarians with the specialist skills they need to be knowledgeable and trustworthy stewards of our rich textual heritage in the years to come," observed RBS Director Michael F. Suarez, S.J. "I am delighted that the pool of applicants was remarkably strong – that bodes very well indeed for the future of special collections librarianship."

The IMLS-RBS Fellowship program is designed to help educate and contribute to the professional development of early-career special collections librarians, with a special emphasis on recruiting participants from groups currently underrepresented in the field. Fellowships include funding to take a course at Rare Book School and to attend the annual conference of the Rare Books and Manuscripts Section (RBMS) of the Association of College & Research Libraries, a division of the American Library Association.

The fellowship program is funded by a \$279,830 grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (<u>IMLS</u>) through their Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Program, and will include a second group of twenty fellowships to be awarded next year. The grant also funds a replicable, longitudinal study of the program's impact on the professional development and career growth of participating fellows.
